

WSE Charles Ellet Award Nomination Form

The Charles Ellet Award recognizes a younger professional who has made the greatest professional development in a given year. To be eligible for the award a person must be a WSE member and be under 35 years of age.

The award was established in 1929 as a memorial to Charles Ellet, a Civil War hero and an engineer, who was considered to be the father of the modern suspension bridge. The recipient of this prestigious award receives a certificate, a small honorarium and possession of a silver loving cup for one year. The cup is engraved with the names of each winner dating back to 1930.

The recipient will be selected by the Awards Committee, and approved by the Board of Trustees, for having made outstanding progress in his or her professional development.
